Where to go to find what you need

If you want to understand more about children and young people's speech, language and communication needs (SLCN) there are many different training and development activities to choose from.

This information sheet gives you an overview of what is on offer, and some useful signposts.

The Speech, language and Communication Framework (SLCF) www.slcframework.org.uk

The SLCF was developed by The Communication Trust. It is a 'one-stop-shop' for training, and sets the key skills and knowledge needed by the children and young people's workforce to support speech, language and communication development and to identify SLCN. It is free to use, and takes users on a journey plotting out their competency level, then signposting relevant courses and development activities.
